"Mission for the Deaf & Hard of Hearing" Sunday

Suggested Lessons

First Lesson: Isaiah 35:4-7

This is the first lesson appointed for Pentecost 16B. It depicts Messiah's power to meet both physical and spiritual needs. Physical weakness and trouble mirror the absolute spiritual need in which we were born. Jesus pointed to his healing work as proof of his Messianic identity (Matthew 11:5; Luke 7:22). As we proclaim the gospel to all, the Word has the power to open the ears of the spiritually deaf and give sight to the spiritually blind.

Second Lesson: Romans 10:8-17

This lesson appears twice in the lectionary (Lent 1C – Romans 10:8b-13; Epiphany 5C – Romans 10:13-17). It emphasizes the importance of all hearing the gospel, because, just as all are alike under sin, so all alike are saved through faith that comes from hearing the Word of Christ. It is our privilege and responsibility to confess the message of the gospel, that others might hear it and be saved.

Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

This is the gospel appointed for Pentecost 16B. "He has done everything well." What an understatement! The remarkable personal attention that Jesus shows to this frightened, deaf man is surpassed only by the complete healing accomplished by this miracle. The man can not only hear again, but can speak plainly, as if he had been hearing all along.
